
But the renown and the uniqueness of Monaco is not restricted within its borders, it comes from the overall responsibility and driving force of H.S.H Prince Albert II.







Sizes of places




Monaco districts arranged according to size in percentage of area and in km²



The sun favours Monaco


Average temperatures per year in °C




A Princely Honour

Despite the fact that approximately 500 people apply for Monegasque citizenship each year, the number of citizens in the Principality increases only with caution. The decision about whether citizenship is granted or refused lies solely with the Princes of Monaco. There are three grounds for dispensation:




- **1** If the father is Monegasque or if the Mother owns citizenship and ancestors of the Principality or if the parents are unknown and the child is born in Monaco.
- **2** Marriage does not automatically give the right to citizenship, but after ten years of marriage an application may be made on certain conditions.
- **3** One possibility for naturalisation could be: 10 years after reaching the age of 18, inhabitant of Monaco, exempt from the obligation of military service in their own country, relinquishment of former citizenship.



The Monégasque kitchen offers a wealth of varied internationally and Mediterranean inspired dishes. Here we introduce four of our most popular dishes and explain how they are prepared.



Other typical dishes

Barbagiuan



Barbagiuan is the Monegasque word for Uncle John. The original recipe is a kind of tortellini filled with chard.



Le Stockfish



Stockfish is a fish stew with tomatoes, bell peppers and onions. There is also a variation with leeks.



Pissaladière in ten steps











mix flour and salt

stir yeast into water

add olive oil to flower

stir in the liquid yeast

now knead the dough









let the dough rise for 30 minutes

slice the onions

sautée them in olive oil

roll out the dough

spread out onions, olives and anchovies on the dough

Preheat the oven to 220 °C, bake for 30 to 35 minutes.

Tip: To make it less salty wash anchovies before putting on dough.

Ingredients



300 g flour



120 ml water

+ some additional water to add while kneading the dough



30 ml olive oil for the dough, 2 tablespoons olive oil for the onions



1/2 tablespoon salt



1/2 cube yeast



25-28 black olives





50-70 g anchovies
